Charles offers chance to eat food fit for a King's Speech

THE public are to get the chance to enjoy fine dining in Buckingham Palace – or at least, the palace as seen in *The King's Speech*.

The five-day event from July 27 will be held in Lancaster House, which stood in for the Queen's residence in the Oscar-winning film.

Prince Charles's sustainability charity, Start, is organising the pop-up restaurant to bring locally sourced British food and organic wines to a wider audience.

Jamie Grainger-Smith, co-founder of Jamie Oliver's Fifteen and the Acorn House restaurants, will head a team of chefs. He said: "This is a fantastic opportunity to show London and the UK that eating and drinking with sustainability at its heart can be achieved without sacrificing quality, flavour and the overall experience."

The Start Pop-Up Restaurant will take lunchtime and evening bookings for meals in the Grand Hall, once admired as resembling "a palace" by Queen Victoria.
